1. How has the Gospel transformed your ideas about being in community with others?

- 2. Read Acts 2:42-47
 - a. The Bible assumes we are living together in community (see this past week's Approaching Sunday blog). How are you staying connected with other believers on a regular basis? Why is this important to you?
- b. The early church shared most meals together (verse 42). How does sharing meals together, and remembering Jesus with every meal, bring the Gospel into your daily life?

c. Do you find praying with others (verse 42) uncomfortable or awkward? If not, share how you overcame those initial feelings. If so, maybe you are overthinking it – how can you find ways and create spaces where praying with others can become natural?

d. Pastor Shaun talked about Connect, Grow, and Serve. In what ways has God wired you to connect, grow, and serve? How are you currently seeing these things in your life? In what ways can "life" keep you from doing these things?

- 3. Read Matthew 28:18-20 & 22:37-39 (for the next two questions):
 - a. The word "go" could also be translated "as you are going". Often, we feel like we must go to a faraway land to truly "go", but that's not what this verse is saying. It's talking about in your everyday life as you are going allowing the Gospel to overflow from you to those around you. What would this look like in your everyday life?

b. Every command of God comes with a promise of God. Whatever God commands He has already done for you to and in you. If He commands you to love Him, it's because He already unconditionally loves you and has filled you with that same love. How does this change the way you view the commands of God?
