 - a. Are we losing? As we look at the culture around us; is the kingdom of God losing ground and losing the battle?
 - b. Are we better? Do we deserve better treatment from God because we have proved ourselves to be less rebellious than those around us?
- 4. What was it that changed Asaph's perspective (Psalm 73:16-20) and how did it change? How can we keep our perspective correct as we view what is going on around us in the world?
